ENVIRONMENTAL AND SOCIAL COMMITMENT PLAN

- The Republic of Nicaragua, represented by MARENA as the Program Entity (PE), will implement the Nicaragua Caribbean Coast Emission Reduction Program (the **Program**), through the Ministry of Environmental and Natural Resources (MARENA) and the Ministry of Finance and Public Credit (MHCP). The International Bank for Reconstruction and Development, acting as trustee for the Tranche B of the Carbon Fund of the Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (hereinafter, the Trustee), has agreed to enter into an Emission Reductions Payment Agreement (ERPA) for the Program.
- 2. The Republic of Nicaragua will implement material measures and actions so that the Program is implemented in accordance with the Environmental and Social Standards (ESSs). This Environmental and Social Commitment Plan (ESCP) sets out the material measures and actions, any specific documents or plans, as well as the timing for each of these.
- 3. The Republic of Nicaragua will implement the Program in a manner that is consistent with the E&S documents required under the ESSs and referred to in this ESCP, namely, the Environmental and Social Management Framework (ESMF), which includes, inter alia: a) Guidelines on Cultural Heritage, b) Guidelines for a Forest Management Plans, c) Guidelines for a Biodiversity Action Plan, and d) Integrated Pest Management Guidelines; Process Framework; Indigenous Peoples Planning Framework (IPPF); the Labor Management Procedures; as well as the Stakeholder Engagement Plan (SEP). Indigenous Peoples Plans (IPPs) will be developed as needed in line with the IPPF.
- 4. The Republic of Nicaragua is responsible for compliance with all requirements of the ESCP even when implementation of specific measures and actions is conducted by MARENA.
- 5. The Republic of Nicaragua will monitor and report to the Trustee on the implementation of the material measures and actions set out in this ESCP, in accordance with the ESCP and relevant conditions of the ERPA. The Trustee will monitor and assess progress to complete the material measures and actions throughout implementation of the Program.
- 6. As agreed by the Trustee and Republic of Nicaragua, this ESCP may be updated from time to time during Program implementation, to reflect Program changes, any unforeseen circumstances, or in response to assessment of Program performance conducted under the ESCP itself. In such circumstances, the Republic of Nicaragua, through the MARENA, will agree with the Trustee, and will update the ESCP to reflect such changes. Agreement on changes to the ESCP will be documented through the exchange of letters signed between the Trustee and the Minister in charge of MARENA. MARENA will promptly disclose the updated ESCP.
- 7. Where Program changes, unforeseen circumstances, or Program performance result in changes to the risks and impacts during Program implementation, the Republic of Nicaragua shall provide additional funds, if needed, to implement actions and measures to address such risks and impacts.
